Concord Awarded MVP Grant from State

CONCORD, MA— On May 29th, the Town of Concord was awarded a \$33,000 Climate Resiliency grant through the State's Municipal Vulnerability Preparedness (MVP) Program. Concord is one of 82 towns receiving more than \$2 million total in grant funding for climate resiliency. The grant funding will allow Concord to identify the Town's vulnerabilities to climate change through a Community Resilience Building Workshop.
