## Town Manager's Report

### Special Election June 12, 2018

A Special Town Election was held on June 12th to vote on 1 question, a bylaw to prohibit non-medical marijuana establishments in Concord.

A “yes” vote on this question would prohibit any marijuana establishment, as defined in chapter 94G, section 1 of the General Laws, from operating in Concord. A “no” vote disapproves the bylaw, meaning the prohibitions described would not take effect in Concord.

With 13.55% of the voting population casting 1,789 votes, the “Yes” vote was victorious with 67% of the vote.
