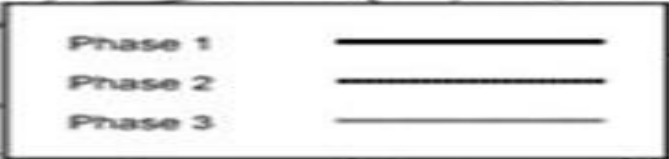
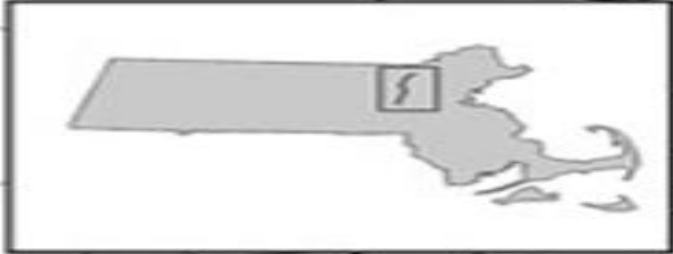
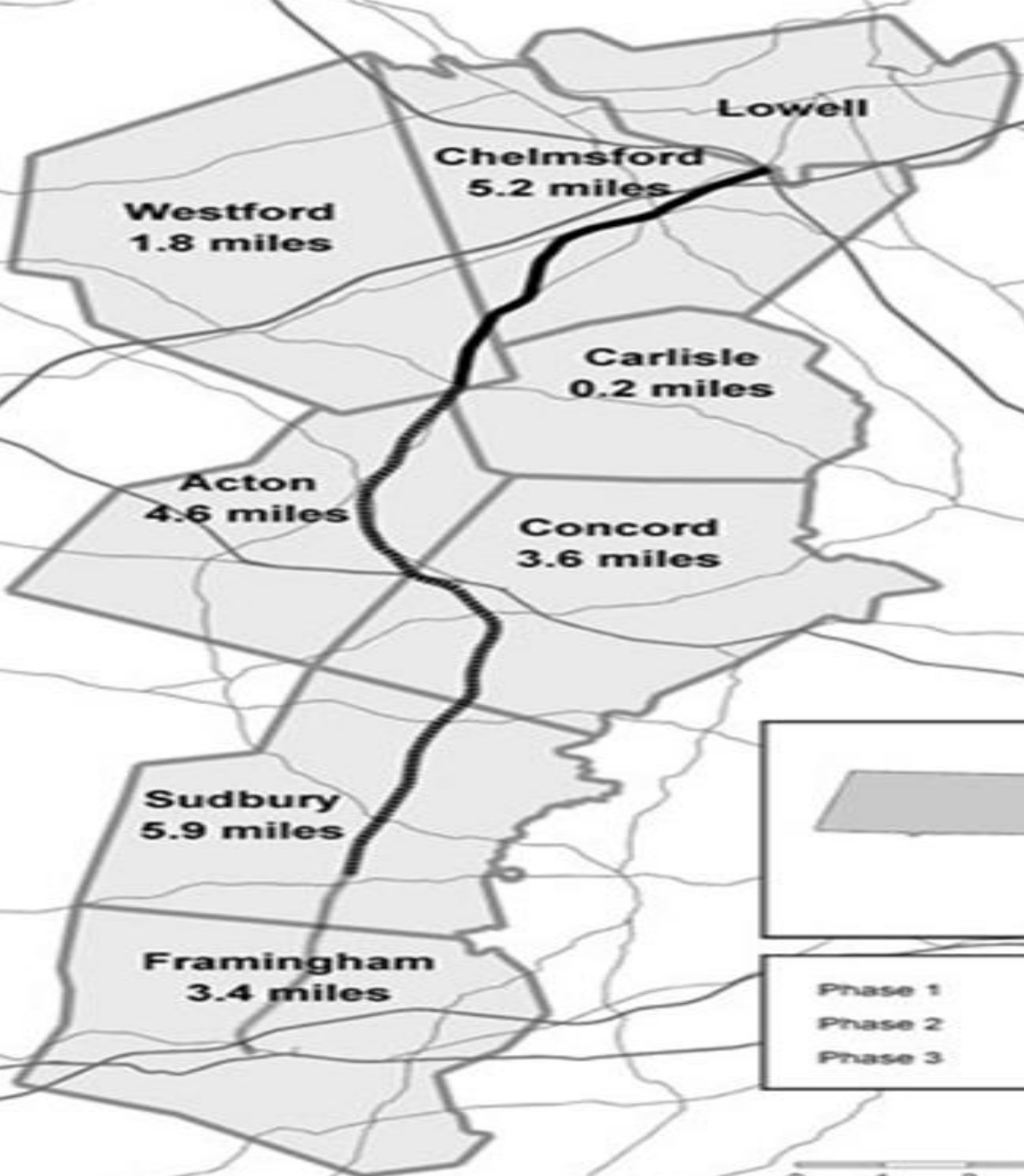
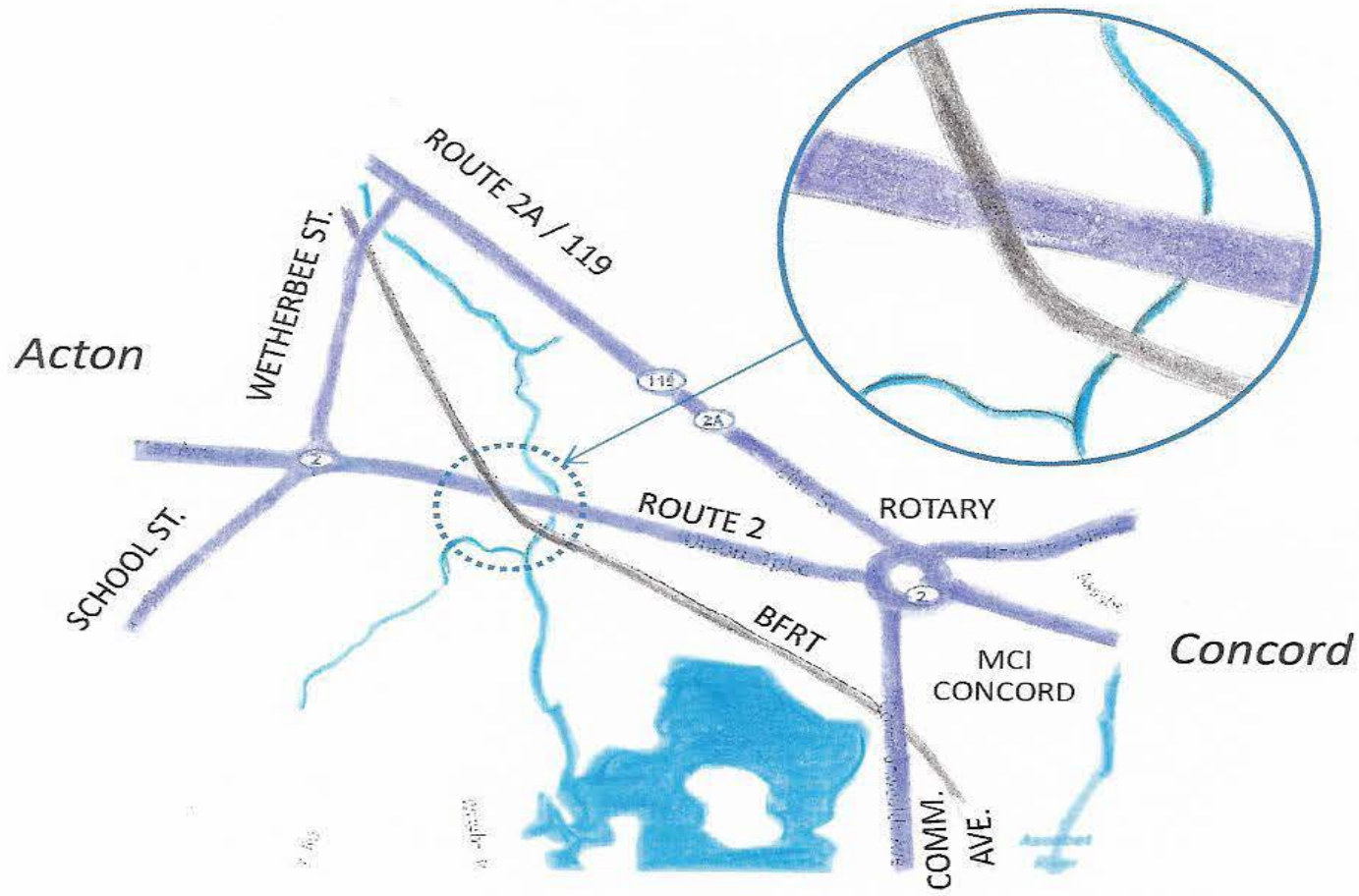


Article 57 Bruce Freeman Rail Trail

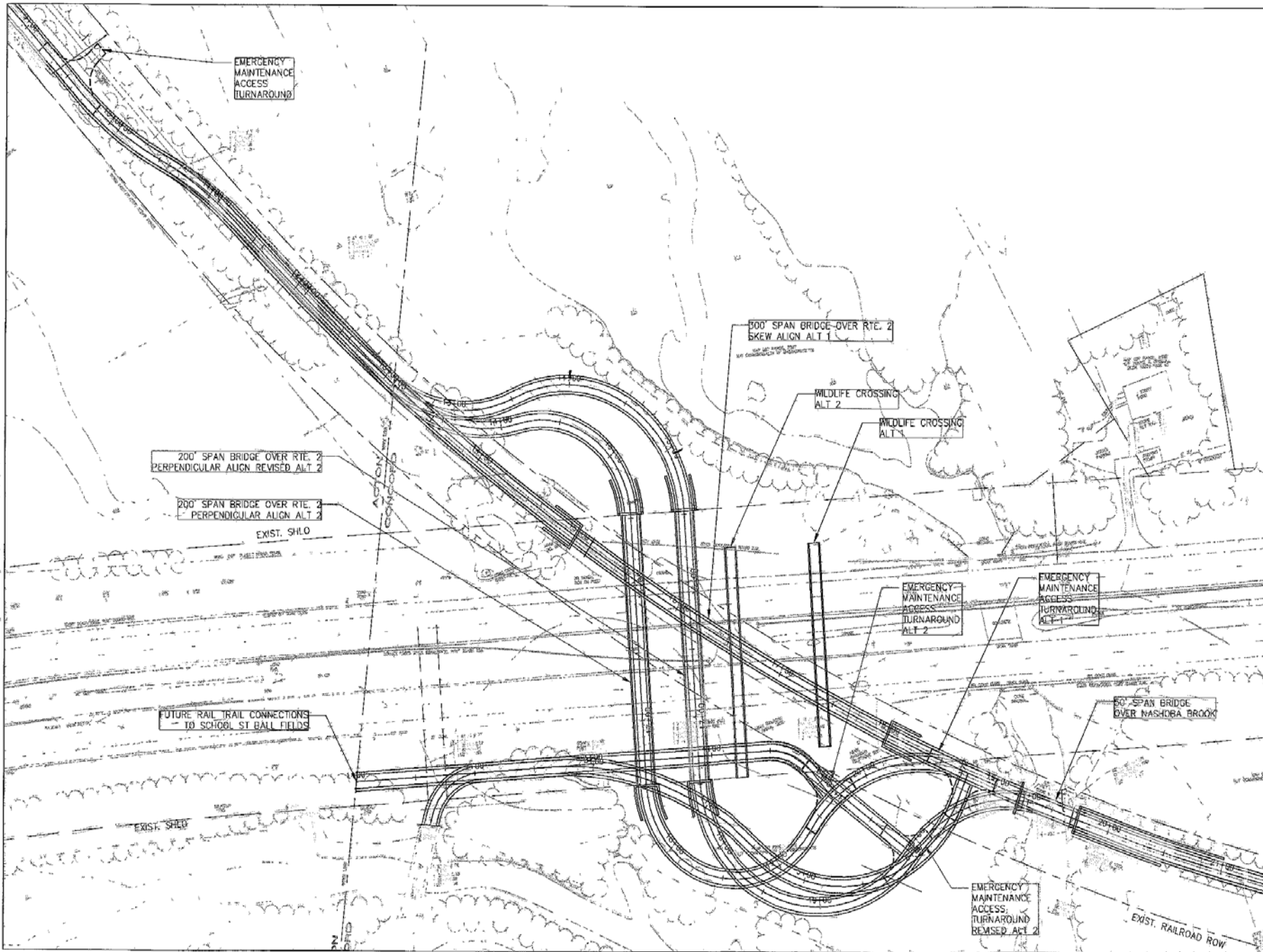


ARTICLE 57. To determine whether the Town will vote to raise and appropriate, or transfer from available funds in the Treasury, or authorize the Town Treasurer with the approval of the Board of Selectmen to borrow by the issuance of bonds or notes under the provisions of Chapter 44 of the Massachusetts General Laws, the sum of \$250,000, or any other sum, to be expended under the direction of the Town Manager for the purpose of completing the Phase 2B design and engineering for the Bruce Freeman Rail Trail, or take any other action relative thereto.

Planning to schedule public hearing on design May/June

After 25%, Concord and Acton will take responsibility
to bring plans to 100%



MDOT has included construction funding of \$6,230,000 for Phase 2B in the FY2018 Congestion Mitigation and Air Quality program.

100% Design plans must be completed by summer of 2018 for advertising in September.

State funding of \$1.2 million was requested to fund the bridge design to 100%. The funds were allocated but not for this project specifically. Efforts are continuing to have the State funds designated for design of Phase 2B.
