

## **FUNDING FOR WHITE POND MANAGEMENT**

## WHITE POND

- Popular for swimming, boating, fishing and hiking.
- White Pond Advisory Committee created in part to monitor water quality in the pond.
- Concern about swimming in Sachem's Cove
- Neighborhood concerns include:
  - use by non-residents
  - overuse of public land could damage water quality
  - parking on neighborhood streets
  - litter, noise, and misbehavior
  - possible Influx of users of Bruce Freeman Rail Trail

- Selectmen Convened a White Pond Forum on January 21
- Consultants were retained to evaluate:
  - White Pond Water Quality and Management Issues
  - Parking Problems
  - Recreational Needs of the Town
- Neighbors have asked that steps be taken to manage use of the public resources.
- \$25,000 not included in Finance Committee's guideline setting process. Selectmen did not want to delay for another year implementation of any consensus management improvements.

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
