Ice Rescue

On March 3rd at 11:39 a.m. the Concord Fire Department was dispatched to Red Coat Lane for a report of a person through the ice in the water. According to CFD Captain Bill Noke, the first unit to arrive was Ambulance 2. Firefighters Brendan Lyons and Chuck Hopkins were shown to the victim's location, and Firefighter Lyons who was in an ice-rescue suit immediately went to the victim and secured him. Firefighter Hopkins and Concord Police Sergeant Mike Burgess had Lyons secured with a tether rope, and once Lyons had the victim secured, Hopkins and Burgess pulled Lyons and the victim to shore. According to Noke, the male victim was transported to Emerson Hospital.
