Town Manager Search Concluded

The Concord Select Board has authorized Municipal Resources, Inc. to make a conditional offer of employment to Stephen Crane for the position of Concord Town Manager. This decision was made on Saturday after a series of interviews with the three finalists held by the Select Board.

UPHOLSTERED FURNITURE—Sofas, sofa beds, loveseats, armchairs, etc. Items are recycled. (\$)

SCRAP METAL AND APPLIANCES—Appliances, air conditioners, gas grills, propane tanks, (lawn mowers & snow blowers: fuel & oil removed), metal pipe, chain link fence, lawn chairs, nails and other items containing at least 75% metal. (\$)

HEARING AIDS—working & nonworking

HOLIDAY LIGHTS—LED & incandescent
