Fuel Assistance for Low-Income Concord Residents

Each year, from November through April, the South Middlesex Opportunity Council (SMOC) offers a fuel assistance program for residents of Massachusetts. The program offers financial assistance to low-income households for heating costs during the winter months. Eligibility is based on annual total gross household income and household size. Residents who qualify receive assistance paid directly to their heating vendor.
