




RETURNING YOUR ANNUAL TOWN CENSUS AND VOTING

Keeping your voter status active is very easy. Simply return your census annually! The Board of Registrars is responsible for keeping the resident and voter lists up to date. Furthermore, the law requires them to move non-responding voters to the inactive voter list. We want to hear from you! Please return your census form. If you have lost it, please contact the Town Clerk's Office and we will mail you a blank form.



Remember that you **cannot register to vote** on the census form, but here are some options: register in person at the Town House, at the RMV, call the Town Clerk's Office to request a registration form be mailed to you, or **Register Online and save time!** www.sec.state.ma.us/ovr/

Absentee ballots are typically available at least three weeks prior to an election. Contact the Town Clerk's office for more information at 978-318-3080. Absentee ballot applications may be filed beginning in January for any elections in that calendar year.
