## HERE'S A BIT OF SILVER LINING DURING THIS DIFFICULT TIME:

*While we are all physically distancing to prevent the spread of coronavirus, we will have more time for each other and the outdoors. Getting outside can help boost you and your family's resilience, too. Remember also that wildlife always need distancing from humans in order to carry out their normal life functions.*

*Our town conservation areas are currently open to provide much needed solace. We need you to help make sure that all visitors can experience a sense of calm and stress relief. And since the health, safety, and well-being of our visitors is our top priority, we have placed the following restrictions on the use of town conservation lands, based upon Governor Baker's Emergency Order and the Department of Health's and CDC's guidance.*

### PLEASE:

- **Practice physical distancing** by keeping at least 6 feet apart, even outdoors. Take the lead and carry a 6-foot rope to ensure that you're practicing physical distancing!
- **Stay home if you are sick, having any symptoms, or if you might have been exposed.**
- **Wash your hands often** with soap and warm water.
- **DO NOT congregate in groups** of any size during your visit. Use a 6-foot rope to ensure that you are maintaining the right distance!
- **Dogs must be controlled at all times and you must pick up and properly dispose of their waste**
- **Check for deer ticks often** while visiting, and again after you get home. Anytime over 40°F you can expect that they are out.
- **Please help out** (and also set a good example) by bringing a trash bag and gloves and picking up trash (and also taking away)... every little bit helps! Thank you.

*\* And please take note of the number of vehicles parked at the conservation area you plan to visit, since this will give you an idea of the number of current visitors. If a lot of vehicles are present, please choose another property or time to visit.*
