

of the mandatory State ethics training by employees and board members. During the year, several inquiries were referred to the appropriate State authorities for formal determinations and rulings.

Department staff prepared and recorded 36 new cemetery deeds during the year, and continued to maintain the cemetery deed, burial permit, and lot records. Nineteen raffle permits were issued to community non-profit organizations. The Town Clerk's Office offers Notary Public services for customers with proper identification. A nominal fee is charged, and appointments are recommended for complex documents. Four staff members have been appointed by the Governor's Office to serve as "Commissioners to Qualify," which authorizes staff to administer the Oath of Office to individuals appointed as a Notary Public or Justice of the Peace in Massachusetts. We continued to receive and process routine genealogical requests, referring the more complex ones to the Library Archivist.

The four-member Board of Registrars consists of two members from each of the major political parties--three members appointed by the Board of Selectmen, plus the Town Clerk.

Note: Detailed voter registration, election results, and a summary of Town Meeting action are reported elsewhere in this Report.

Voter Registration

The Town Clerk's Office continued to utilize the State's Voter Registration Information System for voter registration. This system connects Concord with Town Clerk offices across the state to avoid duplication of voter registrations, and allows residents to register to vote or change their address or party affiliation at the Registry of Motor Vehicles.

During the year when we encountered petition signers

who were not registered voters in Concord (and therefore could not be certified as signers), we mailed voter registration forms to them, resulting in an excellent return. We also continue to do this with younger residents when they reach voting age at 18, with good results. The Office registered 820 new voters during the year, ending the year with 12,581 voters. In addition, 1,017 voters were deleted, 200 switched parties, and 369 were placed on Inactive Voter status due to either not returning a census form, or information that we received that they no longer live in Concord. The number of registered voters declined following the November election, after we completed our biennial voter purge of inactive voters (after 4 years of inactivity).

Census

As has been done for the past several years, the Town Clerk's Office printed and prepared the census forms in-house, instead of using an outside vendor, resulting in a considerable cost savings. The forms were distributed to residents in late December. The January 2014 population per the Town Census was 15,830. Note that the Town Census does not include the prison population, while the Federal decennial census counts the prisoners.

Town Caucus—January 27, 2014

Turnout for the Town Caucus was high, with 97 in attendance. One individual was nominated each for Town Moderator and Board of Selectmen. Two were nominated for one position on the School Committee. No one was nominated for the one vacancy on the Concord Housing Authority. All are to be commended for their willingness to run for office and serve the Town in these volunteer capacities.

Annual Town Election—March 25, 2014

Turnout was modest, with 17% of registered voters participating, despite the one contested School Committee race. The five-year position for Concord Housing Authority was won by Edward Tar Lerner, who ran a write-in campaign and garnered 84 votes. There were 135 absentee ballots distributed for this Election. Concord was one of two communities that field-tested new voting equipment at this election, on behalf of the State. Concord received some financial benefit by agreeing to serve as one of the test sites, saving programming and printing costs. The test went well and the new equipment has been certified by the State as one of two models of electronic voting equipment available for use in Massachusetts.

Annual Town Meeting—May 4, 5 and 6, 2014

The Annual Town Meeting featured 59 Warrant Articles (including eight submitted by petition) and was attended by 409 registered voters on the first night, 684 the second night, and 496 on the third and final night. During the course of the three nights of Town Meeting, 894 different voters were in attendance (7% of the registered voters in Concord).

Special Town Meeting—May 5, 2014

A Special Town Meeting was held within the Annual Town Meeting, with five Warrant Articles (including one submitted by petition). There were 684 in attendance.

State Primary—September 9, 2014

The State Primary brought out 25% of the registered voters in Concord. There was only one contested race on the Republican ballot, which was chosen by only 481 voters. There were several hotly contested races on the Democratic ballot, which was chosen by 2,638 voters. There were 184 absentee ballots distributed for this election.

State/Federal Election—November 4, 2014

Voter turnout for this election was high, with 64% of voters participating. There were 865 absentee ballots distributed for this Election, including 39 distributed overseas to current or former Concord residents residing overseas. Most of these were sent electronically to these voters residing in 20 different countries in five continents.

Nomination Papers/Initiative Petitions

During the year, we certified 146 signatures on nine Annual Town Meeting petitions (one of which was later withdrawn, prior to the publication of the Warrant); 105 signatures on one Special Town Meeting petition; 2,554 signatures on nomination papers for candidates for the State Primary or State Election ballots; and 698 signatures on various State Initiative Petitions. Voters are reminded to sign nomination papers and petitions using their legal voting name and address.
