Staff

The Division is staffed by Assistant Town Clerk Patricia Clifford; Senior Department Clerk Arlene Fitzpatrick; and Office Assistant Bridget Rodrigue. The achievements of the Division are in large part due to the effort and commitment of these individuals, which is noted and appreciated.

Vitals

The presence of Emerson Hospital in the community results in a high number of birth recordings in Concord. The number of overall births remained fairly consistent for the past five years. It should be noted that the number of births to Concord parents in 2012 (102) is only 58% of the number recorded as recently as 2000 (176). The Office had a brisk business of certified copies of births, deaths and marriages, with 6,160 issued, generating revenue of \$65,061. In addition, the staff processed 32 Affidavit and Correction of Vital Records, and issued 351 burial permits. Online offerings for the processing of birth, death and marriage certificates have proven to be very popular with customers, with 1,498 transactions taking place online (up 11% from 2011). Of note is that 39% of all birth certificates and 26% of marriage certificates are now requested online. This online offering allows us to provide expedited service for vital records (at an additional charge) and reduces the number of walk-in customers, allowing us to better manage the Division's workload.

The Town Clerk is currently serving on a State task force to plan for significant changes in the way death certificates are developed, recorded and issued. The pilot began during 2012 and implementation is expected to occur during 2013. This follows the implementation of a Statewide electronic system for the recording and issuance of birth certificates beginning in 2011. These long-awaited changes—to provide for the electronic generation, recording and issuance of vital records—are the most significant improvements made to these processes in many generations. The Town's partnership with Emerson Hospital and the State Office of Vital Records & Statistics in these efforts has been appreciated.

Licenses

We reached another record for dog license issued during the year—1,914. Income of \$31,661 was received by the Town for dog licenses and late fees. Staff participated in the Rabies Vaccination Clinic sponsored by the Board of Health in March.

Town Meeting

The Town Clerk and staff attended and recorded the proceedings of the Annual Town Meeting and Special Town Meeting during the year. For all Town Meeting events, we offered a daily update on the previous evening's session on the Town's web site, which proved very popular with residents. An excerpted copy of the proceedings is included elsewhere in this Report.

The Division issued 135 Business Certificates during the year.

Miscellaneous

During the year, the staff swore in new committee and board appointees and posted 843 public meetings. Meeting postings are available on the bulletin board in the Town House lobby and for view on the Town's web site at www.concordma.gov. During the course of the year, the Office provided information to staff, boards and committees, and citizens on the issues of the Open Meeting, Public Records, Conflict of Interest, and Campaign & Political Finance Laws. State legislative action during 2009 made several significant changes to these laws which took effect between December 2009 and July 2010, with regulations adopted and amended several times since that time. The Town Clerk's Office is involved in administering and implementing many of these changes. Among the new initiatives are mandatory ethics training for Town and School employees and committee/board members; the elimination of Saturdays in the computation of 48-hour notice for meeting postings; requirement that agendas be posted and made available for all public meetings; expanded requirements for the contents of meeting minutes; and the requirement that some campaign finance filings be posted on the Town's website. The Town Clerk conducted training in the new Ethics Law for several groups of Town employees and board members. In conjunction with Town Counsel, Open Meeting Law training was conducted for staff and committee/board members in June. During the year, several inquiries were referred to the appropriate State authorities for formal determinations and rulings.

Division staff prepared and recorded 50 new cemetery deeds during the year, and continued to maintain the cemetery deed, burial permit, and lot records. Thirteen raffle permits were issued to community non-profit organizations. The Town Clerk's Office offers Notary Public services for customers with proper identification. A nominal fee is charged, and appointments are recommended for complex documents. Four staff members have been appointed by the Governor's Office to serve as "Commissioners to Qualify," which authorizes staff to administer the Oath of Office to individuals appointed as a Notary Public or Justice of the Peace in Massa-

chusetts. We continued to receive and process routine genealogical requests, referring the more complex ones to the Library Archivist.

Voter Registration

The Town Clerk's Office continued to utilize the State's Voter Registration Information System for voter registration. This system connects Concord with Town Clerk offices across the State to avoid duplication of voter registrations, and allows residents to register to vote or change their address or party affiliation at the Registry of Motor Vehicles.

During the year, when we encountered petition signers who were not registered voters in Concord (and therefore could not be certified as signers), we mailed voter registration forms to them, resulting in an excellent return. We also continue to do this with younger residents when they reach voting age at 18, with good results. The Office registered 1,553 new voters during the year, ending the year with a record 12,716 voters. In addition, 1,129 voters were deleted, 341 switched parties during 2012, and 193 were placed on Inactive Voter status due to either not returning a census form, or information that we received indicating they no longer live in Concord. The volume of voter registration additions/deletions and changes was significantly higher than normal due to the high interest in the Presidential Election. As of November 6, Concord had a record of 13,018 registered voters. The number declined after the election, after we completed our biennial voter purge of inactive voters (after 4 years of inactivity).

Census

As has been done for the past several years, the Town Clerk's Office printed and prepared the census forms in-house, instead of using an outside vendor, resulting in a considerable cost savings. The forms were distributed to residents in late December. The January 2012 population per the Town Census was 15,638. The Town Clerk distributed a supplemental mini-census to residents of Concord Mews (350-unit apartment complex in West Concord), to encourage voter registration, doglicensing and census return. This resulted in 303 residents from this complex being added to the Census from this address, including 200 new voters.

Town Caucus—January 9, 2012

The Caucus was held early due to moving up the date of the Annual Town Election to coincide with the Presidential Primary. Turnout was modest, with only 55 in attendance. One individual was nominated for Town Moderator and two each were nominated for Board of Selectmen, School Committee and Concord Housing Authority. One individual nominated for Board of Selectmen later withdrew, resulting in two active write-in campaigns. All are to be commended for their willingness to run for office and serve the Town in these volunteer capacities.

Annual Town Election—March 6, 2012

Voter turnout (24%) was higher than in recent years due to the Annual Town Election and Presidential Primary being held jointly on one day. There was a contested race for two seats on the Board of Selectmen, with one name on the ballot and two others running active write-in campaigns. There was also a contested race for Concord Housing Authority, with two individuals running for one seat. Candidates for Moderator and School Committee ran uncontested.

Presidential Primary—March 6, 2012

The 2012 Presidential Primary was the first election where Massachusetts election officials were authorized to distribute electronic ballots to overseas and military voters. This proved to be very popular, with overseas voters given the option of returning the ballots electronically via e-mail, fax or postal mail. Voter turnout was 24%, with 2,973 voters participating. There were 196 absentee ballots distributed for this Election.

Annual Town Meeting—April 23, 24, 25 and 26, 2012

The Annual Town Meeting featured 48 Warrant Articles (including 5 submitted by petition) and was attended by 390 registered voters at the first session; 650 at the second; 813 at the third; and 440 at the fourth and last session. During the course of the four nights of Town Meeting, 1,183 different voters were in attendance (9.7% of the registered voters in Concord). Special Town Meeting—April 24, 2012

A Special Town Meeting was held within the Annual Town Meeting, to address 8 Warrant Articles (includ-

ing four by petition) and was attended by 651 registered voters. An excerpted copy of the Special Town Meeting minutes is available elsewhere in this Report.

State Primary—September 6, 2012

The State Primary featured a number of active contests, most notably the State Senate race to fill the seat being vacated by Susan Fargo. A record of five Concord residents were on the ballot for various races—Cory Atkins, Michael J. Benn, Mara Marie Dolan, Joe Kearns Goodwin and Gregory P. Howes. This local connection contributed to the fairly high voter turnout for a primary—31%.

State/Federal/Presidential Election—November 6, 2012


The Town Clerk’s Office was very busy this fall due to the high interest in the races for Congress and President. We experienced a record number of registered voters (13,018) as well as a record number of absentee ballots distributed (2,027—18% of the votes cast). The Board of Registrars hand counted the overseas ballots that were returned electronically and returned by Election Day (105) and those that were postmarked from overseas by Election Day that arrived by November 16 (19). The Election went smoothly, with a turnout of 85%. Waiting lines were minimal for most of the day, with voters coming to the polls prepared.

Nomination Papers/Initiative Petitions

During the year, we certified 81 signatures on five Annual Town Meeting petitions; 773 signatures on four April Special Town Meeting petitions; 2,205 signatures on nomination papers for candidates for the September and November 2012 State ballots; and 625 signatures on various State Initiative Petitions.

Polling Hours

At the request of the Board of Registrars, the Board of Selectmen voted at a joint meeting in August to shorten the polling hours for local elections when there are no contested races on the ballot. Hopefully this will happen infrequently but, if it does happen, then polls will be open from Noon to 8:00 pm, at a cost savings of approximately \$5,000.
