

The Public Works Commission Has Declared a State of Water Supply Conservation

LAWN WATERING RESTRICTION

Due to ongoing critical infrastructure improvements at our Nagog Pond supply, this source remains offline for the immediate future.

While recent rainfall events have temporarily alleviated drought conditions in our region, rising temperatures and a lack of significant rain events predicted in the forecast are expected to result in increased water demand.

To curtail water use, the following mandatory **LAWN WATERING RESTRICTION** remains in effect until further notice.

Lawn Watering – Restricted to 1 day per week

You may hand water your flower beds, shrubs, foundation plantings and vegetable gardens.

This restriction requires all residential and commercial customers served by Concord Water to reduce lawn watering to 1 day per week, **effective immediately**. Please adjust your irrigation controller accordingly to avoid issuance of a mandatory lawn watering ban. If you are unable to adjust your controller, contact your irrigation professional for assistance.

Concord Public Works is monitoring customer demand and available water supply around the clock and will provide additional information as it becomes available. ***Until infrastructure improvements are complete and the Nagog Pond supply becomes operational, our water supply and demand situation will remain tenuous.*** Your individual effort is imperative in ensuring that our water demand does not exceed our available supply.
