Community

- Sergeant Rennie and Officer Mailloux attended a training meeting at the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers on Virginia Road. The meeting was to discuss the safety of the building and its employees, as well as to prepare for an upcoming training event.

- Lieutenant Landers and Lieutenant Goldman attended a Concord 250th Public Safety Committee working group meeting along with members of the Concord Fire Department on the 3rd floor of the Public Safety complex.
- Lieutenant Landers took part in a “Code Pink” drill at Emerson Hospital which involved testing the security protocols of the Hospital as well as the procedures involving a police response.

Fire Department

Calls for Service: Over the week, CFD responded to 110 calls for service.

Community:

- Assistant Chief Latta, Lieutenant Nichols, and Chief Judge attended a meeting with a Middle School contractor focused on the requirements of site safety plans as required by the Massachusetts Fire Code.
- Captain Whitney attended a meeting at Hanscom regarding an upcoming multi agency drill hosted by Massport.

Training: Water rescue training has continued throughout the week. Crews were also trained with technical rescue equipment designed for lifting and hauling victims.

Public Works

Commonwealth Ave Reconstruction: A second meeting with project abutters was held on Monday June 26th at 5:00 p.m. at Concord Art and Antiques. The meeting was well attended with Engineering staff, Newport Construction, and Concord Police discussing the construction schedule, handling of pedestrian & vehicular traffic, parking, access, and other impacts to store fronts. Work is scheduled to start in earnest on July 5th.

Main Street/Walden Street Intersection Improvement Project: The Engineering Division received bids for this project and is in the process of evaluating them to make a recommendation which will award a contract for construction to begin this summer.

Concord Carlisle High School Access Road: The Engineering Division received bids for this reconstruction project and is in the process of assisting the school in the execution of a contract with UEL Contractors, Inc. It is anticipated that the majority of the work will be completed during the school summer vacation.

Nagog Pond - Phase 2 Intake Rehabilitation: D&C Construction, working in concert with Insituform Technologies, completed the cleaning and lining of 1,450 linear feet of original 16-inch intake piping (circa 1909) located within the limits of the Nagog Pond Cove. Water operations crews are in the process of servicing the



ozone treatment facility in anticipation of bringing this source of supply back on-line in the near future.
