Fire Department

Calls for Service

Friday, July 26 - Thursday, August 8, 2024

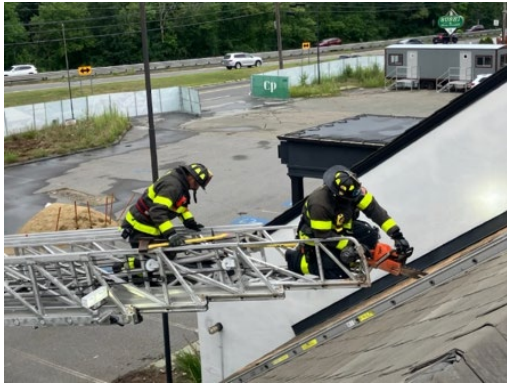
During the two-week period of July 26 to August 8, the Fire Department responded to 177 calls for service. Responses included a vehicle into a building causing minor damage, a bicycle accident that required disentangling it from the patient before transport to the hospital, and a vehicle fire.

FEMA Response

Assistant Chief Walter Latta, who is also a member of the FEMA Region 1 Task Force, was activated this week in preparation for the heavy rain and flooding expected from Hurricane Debby. His initial assignment is to Macon Georgia as one of the team's logistical personnel. From there he was moved to the South Carolina Fire Academy, where he will assist in coordinating personnel and resource deployment throughout the region.

Training

Crews have been training at the former Papa Razi property for the past several weeks. The building is scheduled for demolition very soon. Some of the final training at this property was practicing roof ventilation with hand and power tools. The department appreciates the current owner providing us with this valuable training opportunity.
