According to 1948 MIT Alumni Register, Wilfred Eugene Carter was President and Horatio Whittemore Brown was treasurer of Air Conditioned Homes, Inc.

Anne Forbes, H Whittemore Brown who was building in the Elm Street/Nashawtuc Hill area, formed the development company Air Conditioned Homes which began to put up small houses all over town. (Narrative histories p. 39)

**H. WHITTEMORE BROWN COLLECTION OF PANORAMIC PHOTOGRAPHS OF CONCORD, MASS., 1955-1958 BIOGRAPHY: H. Whittemore Brown (1893-1980); b. Concord, Mass.; d. Decatur, Georgia) was a long-time Concord resident. A 1911 graduate of Concord High School and 1915 graduate of the Massachusetts Institute**

of Technology, he was commissioned a First Lieutenant in the U.S. Army during World War I. Brown was a builder and general contractor in the Concord area and served his community in multiple capacities. He served as Acting Town Manager, on the Board of Appeals, and three terms as a member of the Board of Selectmen. In 1936, Brown chaired the committee for the town's 300th anniversary celebration. He was an honorary member of the Concord Rotary Club, which recognized him as their Man of the Year in 1961. For thirty-nine years, he served as a director of the Concord Cooperative Bank. He served on the Board of Trustees of the American Unitarian Association and was appointed a trustee emeritus of Marlboro College in Marlboro, Vermont. For these and other contributions to Concord, Brown was named Concord's Honored Citizen in 1967. Brown married Marjorie Wray. The couple had two daughters, Patricia and Shirley, and a son, Christopher.
